Course Description

Since it was first enacted in 2016, the legislature has continued to make changes in the body worn cameras for peace officers and amendments made in 2023 and 2025 further complicate the data practices and related aspects of body worn cameras. In addition, a growing number of jails are equipping staff with body worn cameras and that presents a completely different set of challenges since the law is very different for peace officers on the street and the jai setting.

In this course we will drill down deeply into the body worn camera statute and review sample policies for the street officer and in the jail. The new law is complex, even contradictory in parts and creates several traps for the unwary. Since a violation of the law can produce a \$15,000 civil penalty per violation this course should be on every agency's must-do list.
